The Vice-Chancellor welcomed the members and called their attention to the Supreme Court judgement published in the media which will have an immediate impact on admissions in the 2008-09 academic session. Anticipating a circular in this issue at any moment from the Ministry of Human Resource Development/ University Grants Commission the Vice-Chancellor said that all the institutions will be required to increase seats by 54% as per the policy of the Govt. of India on the 27% reservation of seats for OBC in admission of students to various programmes of studies in the university. In view of this it is imperative that the university makes necessary preparation for accommodating the additional students in the academic programmes and the hostels as well. The issue was placed for discussion and following decisions were taken:

- It may be relevant to note that the TU-admission process for 2008-09 has been initiated.
- a. The additional students be admitted in a phased manner. 50% of the additional students be admitted to all programmes in the current session 2008-09 and the remaining 50% be admitted in the next session.

As discussed in the meeting with the Vice Chancellor, Pro Vice Chancellor, Controller of Examination and Head, Department of Commerce on 24 January 2017, following points placed for consideration:

1. **Exercise of Option of Lateral Exit/Continuation:** The students, who have opted for the option of Lateral Exit, will be provided with B Com (Hons) Certificate on successful completion of all requirements till 6th Semester of the Integrated M Com program. The Department will provide the list of students as per specialization/major subjects. The students who have opted to continue, later on, fails to take admission in the 7th semester, has to pay a processing fee equal to the admission fee i.e. Rs. 18,303/- to make them possible for obtaining the B Com (Hons) Certificate, if otherwise found eligible.

2. **TUEE Module:** There will be two separate tests viz. one for entry to the First Semester i.e. B Com module for 10+2 pass-out candidates and another for entry to the Seventh Semester i.e. M. Com. module for B Com (Hons/Major) graduates candidates.

3. **Intake:** As 19 (nineteen) students have submitted the option to continue, the intake for the academic session for entry into the 7th Semester of Integrated M Com may be taken as 11 (eleven), total intake being 30 (thirty). Additional 2 (two) seats may be offered as Self Supported Seats (SSS). Students who had taken admission at the first semester against SSS may be converted to normal seats FROM Seventh Semester onwards, if they choose to continue the programme. This policy may be followed in future also. Reservation of seats will be followed for 11 seats as per Government of India rules.


4. **Fee Structure:** Fee Structure will be same as that of MA programme i.e. on Admission Rs. 18,303/ followed by Rs. 10,003/- for each subsequent semester.

5. **Eligibility:**

(a) Integrated M Com (First Semester) - B Com module: Minimum 60% marks in 10+2 Examination.

(b) Integrated M Com (Seventh Semester) - M Com module: B Com with minimum of 50% marks in major/honours. Mathematics at degree level is desirable. Candidates not having major/honours must have 55% marks in aggregate.

Minutes of BOS meeting held on 09 October, 2015 at 3.00p.m

A meeting of the Board of Studies, Department of Business Administration was held on 09 October, 2015 at 3.00p.m in the chamber of the Head of the Department to discuss the proposal of introduction of Master's Programme in Tourism and Travel Management and revision of course curriculum of MBA Programme. Twelve internal members were present in the meeting. External members could not attend the meeting due to some pre-occupations.

The HOD of the department of Business Administration and Chairperson, BOS welcomed the members. He apprised the house about the background of the agenda items for discussion which was followed by a detailed discussion.

Resolution 1: Introduction of the Master's Programme in Tourism and Travel Management (MTTM)

After detailed discussion on the proposal presented by Prof. M.K. Sarma, the members of the BOS recommends the proposal, course curriculum and the detailed syllabus (1st year) for introducing the two year Master's programme in Tourism and Travel Management(MTTM). The meeting recommended that the initial intake for the programme should not be more than 15 which may be increased subsequently looking at the demand, the logistics and faculty strength of the department. The BOS also noted that for certain specialized courses qualified Guest faculty need to be engaged as and when necessary. The committee also recommended including outdoor activities in the curriculum.

Resolution 2: Discontinuation of PGDTM programme.

In view of the Resolution No 1 above, the BOS recommends discontinuation of the existing one year Post Graduate Diploma Programme in Tourism Management (PGDTM) w.e.f. Autumn session, 2016.

Tourism is still a nascent sector in the Northeast region of the country and as the industry received importance from the new central Government, it can safely be presumed that it would see an unprecedented growth in the near future.

This course is designed to cater to the need of professionally trained manpower in tourism sector of the region in particular, and that of the country in general.

Generally the economic development of a region is thought to be directly linked with inbound tourism. Hence the course is designed putting more emphasis on inbound tourism, and start-up developments through training in small business generation. Nevertheless, other essential components of tourism are also taken care of.

Therefore, it is assumed that this course is not a run-of-the-mill course that has been conventionally available in this region and the country.

USP of the course is (a) emphasis on inbound tourism; (b) adequate stress on small business generation through training on entrepreneurship.

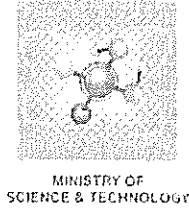
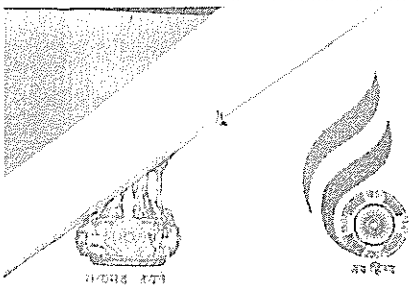



The Vice-Chancellor welcomed the members and called their attention to the Supreme Court judgement published in the media which will have an immediate impact on admissions in the 2008-09 academic session. Anticipating a circular in this issue at any moment from the Ministry of Human Resource Development/ University Grants Commission the Vice-Chancellor said that all the institutions will be required to increase seats by 54% as per the policy of the Govt. of India on the 27% reservation of seats for OBC in admission of students to various programmes of studies in the university. In view of this it is imperative that the university makes necessary preparation for accommodating the additional students in the academic programmes and the hostels as well. The issue was placed for discussion and following decisions were taken:

1. It may be relevant to note that the 50% reservation for OBC has been ^{maintained} ~~reduced~~.
2. The additional students be admitted in a phased manner. 50% of the additional students be admitted to all programmes in the current session 2008-09 and the remaining 50% be admitted in the next session.

BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B.VOC.) PROGRAMME in (i) Renewable Energy and (ii) Food Processing

The University Grants commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on Skills Development based Higher Education as a part of University education, leading to the three years Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree. As per the guidelines of the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF), the programme facilitates multiple exit points viz., (i) Diploma (after the completion of first two semester), (ii) Advanced Diploma (after the completion of first four semester), and (iii) B.Voc. Degree (after the completion of all six semesters).

The curriculum for the programme is a suitable mix of general education and skill development components. The general education component adheres to the normal University standards and constitutes 40% of the total curriculum, whereas skill development component constitutes 60%. The focus of the skill development component is to equip students with appropriate knowledge, practice and attitude, so as to make them ready as per the skill requirements for industrial jobs.

Considering the need of the region and the reported National Occupational Standards (NOS) by the respective Sector Skill Councils and with the approval of the UGC, Tezpur University has introduced B Voc ^{Programme} in following two vocational trades: ^{or} ^{trades}

(a) B. Voc. (Agriculture) – (Renewable Energy)

(b) B. Voc. (Agriculture) – (Food Processing)

These ^{programmes} are being offered w.e.f. the academic year 2015-16 with the board objectives of providing judicious mix of skills relating to selected trades and appropriate content of general education, enhancing employability of the graduates and to meet industry requirements by integration of NSQF within conventional education.

- III. The institution shall ensure that the required number of academic staff duly approved by affiliating body for conducting the course should always remain in position.

4. The recognition/permission is subject to the condition that the institution shall move gradually to become a composite institution but not later than 2016-2017.

5. Further, the recognition/permission is subject to fulfillment of all such other requirements as may be prescribed by other regulatory bodies like UGC, affiliating University / Body, the State Government etc, as applicable.

6. The institution shall submit to the Regional Committee a Self-Appraisal Report at the end of each academic year along with the statement of annual accounts duly audited by a Chartered Accountant.

7. 

- e) Fee charged from students;
- f) Available infrastructural facilities;
- g) Facilities added during the last quarter;
- h) Number of books in the library, journals subscribed to, and additions, if any, in the last quarter;
- i) The affidavit with enclosure submitted along with application;
- j) The institution shall be free to post additional relevant information, If it so desires.
- k) Any false or incomplete information on its website shall render the institution liable for withdrawal of recognition.

8. The institution shall adhere to the mandatory disclosure in the prescribed format and display up-to-date information on its official website.

9. The institution shall make available list of students admitted on its official website.

10. If the institution contravenes any of the above conditions or the provision of the NCTE Act, Rules, Regulations and orders made and issued there under, the institution will render itself liable to adverse action including withdrawal of recognition / permission by the Regional Committee under the provisions of Section 17(1) of the NCTE Act.












The Board of Studies for PG Programme of Civil Engineering Department in its meeting dated 09-11-2016 discussed the matter of submitting the proposal of starting *M.Tech. programme in Civil Engineering* with intake capacity of 18 seats from Academic Session 2017-18, initially with specialization in Geotechnical Engineering. All members of the BoS went through the proposal and the detailed syllabi along with the referee reports and the action taken on the reports. Following are the observations:

- 1) Referee, Prof. D.K.Baidya, IIT Kgp, has commented on the structure and syllabi as a good proposal for post graduate programme in Civil Engineering with specialization in Geotechnical Engineering. Prof. Baidya has made a few suggestions regarding grouping of Electives which has appropriately been incorporated in the final curriculum and syllabi.
- 2) Refree, Prof. Binu Sharma, AEC, in her first review, suggested minor modifications to some contents of a couple of courses. The CE Dept. discussed the modifications and forwarded the proposal to referee after suitable incorporation of the suggestions. This second draft curriculum and syllabi has now been found to be okay by the referee.

The BoS noted the CE dept. has 3 faculty with PhD with Geotechnical Engineering specialization. The existing laboratory facility is also found adequate to offer M.Tech. in Civil Engineering with Specialization in Geotechnical Engineering. It also considered the fact that Geotechnical Engineering is an inseparable component in all civil infrastructure projects. With the surge in infrastructural projects in NE India the demand of well trained geotechnical engineers is on the rise.

The BoS recommends that the attached final proposal of the Civil Engineering Department to start M. Tech programme in Civil Engineering with a total intake capacity of 18 seats be submitted to the Controller of Examinations through School Board of SoE for approval of Academic Council.

The BoS also noted that Initially in this proposal the CE department proposes to offer specialization in Geotechnical Engineering with 9 seats during academic session 2017-18. The dept. plans to offer specialization in Environmental Engineering within the total intake of 18 seats from the subsequent academic session (2018-19), the proposal for which will be submitted later.
