Tezpur University Convocation

Tezpur University organised its XVII Convocation on December 23, 2019, at Kalaguru Bishnuprasad Rabha auditorium of the University. A total of 1275 students had been conferred upon Degrees and Diplomas amongst which, 82 were awarded PhDs, 749 Masters, 402 Under Graduates (B.Tech/B.Sc/BA), and 42 Diplomas and PG Diplomas.

Prof. D. P. Singh, Chairman, University Grants Commission (UGC), and Former Director, National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bengaluru, was the Chief Guest, while Hon'ble Governor of Assam, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi presided over the Convocation as the Chancellor of the University.

Workshop on Hengul-Haital Painting Tradition of Early Assam

A workshop on Hengul-Haital Painting Tradition of Early Assam was organized from 16 to 21 February 2020. The workshop was an outreach activity to help the society in a much-needed restoration of worn out valuable traditional woodcarvings and revival of a dying art form - paintings of woodcarvings with Hengul-Haital and other traditional pigments of early and medieval Assam. This is the third in a series of workshops started with the support of Tezpur University.

The restoration of some worn-out woodcarvings following the traditional painting style has been rigorously practiced in the workshop. A team of 28 people have been trained in the tradition. Moreover, a team of 13 expert artists have been prepared through the workshop, who now can take up similar restoration works or artworks independently.

World Environment Day 2020 Celebrated

The celebration comprised four events namely, tree plantation, webinar, online photography competition and online painting competition. The first event of the programme was ‘tree plantation’ led by Prof. Vinod Kumar Jain, Vice Chancellor of Tezpur University, on the University premises on June 5, 2020. Prof. Jain delivered a webinar on “Environmental concerns and overview” on the same day. Online photography and painting competitions were also organized on the theme “Biodiversity during pandemic Covid-19 or Post Covid-19”.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Tezpur University under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (a flagship programme under the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, aimed at bringing about rural transformation by engaging the knowledge, skill and expertise of higher educational institutions across the country) has adopted five villages, viz., Amolapam, Napaam, Adabari, No.3 Jhawani and Harigaon. A team of faculty members from Tezpur University conducted several awareness and development activities such as Gaon Sabhas at these villages.

Training on conducting the inquiries of sexual harassment

A training on conducting the inquiries of sexual harassment and standard operating procedure for conducting enquiries for ICC Members was held on February 21, 2020. Ms. Anurita Hazarika, State Director - North East Network (NEN), Guwahati, was invited to conduct the training programme. She explained the inquiry process with the help of certain cases she handled as an external member in a few ICCs. She also provided resource materials to help make the policy for TU. At the end of the session there was a detailed discussion with the resource person on a real-life scenario of sexual harassment that could happen in any educational institution and the measures to be followed by the ICC.

Faculty Development Programs

- The Department of Commerce organized an online five-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on “Emerging Business Issues” during May 11-15, 2020. As many as 186 faculty members, teaching in the domain of commerce and management from different states of the country as well as abroad participated in the FDP.
- The Teaching Learning Centre and IQAC, Tezpur University, jointly conduct a “Hands-on Workshop on Integration of Basic ICT Tools in Teaching Pedagogy” during June 8-9, 2020, for the teaching fraternity of Tezpur University. The primary objective of the Workshop was to enable the teachers to use household ICT tools for creation and dissemination of e-resources. Altogether 91 faculty members from the University participated in the workshop.
- The Department of Education organized a one-day webinar on “Reorienting Academic Leadership, Pedagogy and Research in the Time of Crisis” on May 30, 2020. A total of 1985 members registered for the webinar from 27 states of India and over 9500 people watched the session on Facebook live.
- The Department of Assamese organized a national webinar on “Contemporary Assamese Literature” on June 12, 2020. The panelists discussed the ways in which twenty-first century has brought about revolutionary social, economic, and political changes with extensive impacts on Assamese literature. The webinar also threw lights on the new experimental techniques of writing in contemporary Assamese literature.
- The Chandraprabha Saikiani Centre for Women’s Studies organized a webinar on “Women and Health Inequalities: An Action Approach during Covid 19 Crisis” on June 24, 2020. The panelists discussed how the COVID- 19 crisis has affected women’s health amidst a situation in which women are not getting the required medical attention.
- The Centre also organized a webinar on “Mental Health crisis during Covid-19 Pandemic: A Gender Dimension” on June 30, 2020. The panelists discussed how the pandemic has widened the inequalities between men and women in terms of economy, labour and employment. Issues of increased domestic violence and intimate partner violence in times of COVID-19 were also discussed during the webinar.

64th Mahaparinirvana Diwas of Babasaheb Dr. B. R. Ambedkar

On December 6, 2019, the 64th Mahaparinirvana Diwas was observed in the office of Dr. Ambedkar Chair at the School of HSS Building, TU. The observation was led by Prof. P. K. Das, Dean, School of Humanities & Social Sciences and honorary member of Local Advisory Committee, Dr. Ambedkar Chair, who paid his floral tribute to one of the greatest Indians of all times. This was followed by a deliberation by Prof. K. Kikhi, Chair Professor, Dr. Ambedkar Chair about the day and achievements of Babasaheb Dr. Ambedkar. Thereafter, a floral tribute was offered by faculty members, scholars, students, and staff members of TU fraternity, and a two-minute silence was observed in the honour of the great man.

Research Methodology Workshop

A ten-day research methodology workshop was organized by the Dr. Ambedkar Chair, TU, in collaboration with the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi, during Nov. 27 - Dec. 6, 2019. The theme of the workshop was "Researching Disadvantaged Status in India". The workshop was an attempt to orient/hone research aptitude among the scholars working in the areas of disadvantaged status. Moreover, considering the importance of interdisciplinarity in the comprehension of the dynamic nature of social reality, the workshop attempted to provide orientation to different relevant disciplines.

Skill Development for the Socially Disadvantaged

As per the mandate and commitment of Dr. Ambedkar Chair towards betterment of disadvantaged lives, the Chair in collaboration with Chandraprabha Saikiani Centre for Women Studies and Department of Social Work made an attempt to impart skills for individual development to the residents of the Harijan colony of Tezpur town in March 2020. The skills selected for this training were related to stitching and fungiculture (Mushroom). Ms. Maya Rani Borah and Mr. Ganga Ram Dahal, resource persons for the programme, conducted practical sessions for the benefit of around 35 individuals.

Events of the Department of Chemical Sciences

The 'Arsiron Nilogon' and 'Fluoride Nilogon' methods developed by a team of scientists led by Prof. Robin Kumar Dutta to remove arsenic and fluoride from contaminated drinking water respectively, received a new dimension with the involvement of agencies like UNICEF, Jal Sakti Ministry, WaterAid India and Art of Living. Ten big and small workshops have been organized for the popularization of the methods during the year. Various organizations have been associated with the work through three MoUs signed with the Department.

129th Birth Anniversary of Babasaheb Dr. B. R. Ambedkar

Events Organized by the MCJ Department

- The department worked as media campaign consultant for road safety programme for the District of Sonitpur, Assam. As part of consultancy initiative, the Department drafted the media campaign to be circulated in the district to involve youth. The campaign also contributed to generate new message design and ideas about road safety.

Awards and Achievements

Tezpur University starts Centre for Public Policy

Tezpur University has started a first of its kind, policy think tank 'Centre for Public Policy and Governance (CPPG)' that aims to be a pioneer in the field of evidence-based research and advocacy to inform and influence public policy in India with special emphasis on North East India. UNICEF would be the technical support partner to Tezpur University in establishing the centre and facilitating implementation of its roadmap for the next few years.

This centre has been modeled to be an interdisciplinary organization with faculty members from various departments associated as experts in their domains of research. Tezpur University has been closely working in collaboration with UNICEF and many other agencies for the past few years through field research, workshops, seminars, etc. to inform the Government for achieving improved delivery of social sector services and influence proactive policies.

Centre of Excellence status awarded to Dept. of Environmental Science

Department of Environmental Science has been awarded Centre of Excellence (CoE) under National Mission for Sustaining the Himalayan Ecosystem (NMSHE) by the Department of Science and Technology (DST), Govt. of India.

Activities carried out by Tezpur University to combat COVID-19

The outbreak of COVID-19 has brought unprecedented challenges to the entire world. India had to impose a nation-wide lockdown to contain the virus. Tezpur University, in accordance with advisories issued by the Govt. of India has taken several steps to prevent the outbreak in the campus.

1. Postponement of Mid Term Examinations and vacating the hostels: The Mid Semester Examinations, scheduled from 14.03.2020, were postponed midway w.e.f 17.03.2020. The students, Ph.D. scholars and project staff residing in hostels vacated their hostels by 18.03.2020. However, the foreign students were allowed to stay in the hostels.

2. Online classes for students/work from home: The faculty members were advised to conduct online classes. Accordingly, most teachers including contractual and guest teachers conducted online lectures through different digital platforms such as Zoom, WebEx, Goto, Google Classroom, YouTube, etc. All employees worked from home during the first lockdown period.

3. Constitution of COVID-19 Task Force: A COVID-19 Task Force was constituted in the University to carry out various activities related to protecting the University community from the virus. The Task Force maintained a strict vigil on the situation and offered valuable inputs taking into consideration advisories issued by the World Health Organization, Govt. of India and Govt. of Assam from time to time.

4. Postponement/Cancellation of Tezpur University Entrance Examination (TUEE): TUEE, which was scheduled to be held during the period of May 29-31, 2020, was postponed and subsequently cancelled in view of the Covid19 pandemic.

5. Constitution of Mental Health Task Force: As per advisory of MHRD, a Mental Health Task Force was constituted in the University. The Task Force has been monitoring the mental health of the students, especially those who are on the campus during lockdown period. In addition to this, faculty members also maintained regular conversations with their respective mentees, through emails, WhatsApp, telephone calls, etc., during this period.

6. Face shields for medical staff to fight COVID-19: The University made two uniquely designed face shields for medical staff to fight against COVID-19. One face shield is 3D printed and the other is made manually in the central workshop of the University.

a. 3D printed face shield: The 3D printed face shields were jointly developed at Embedded Systems and Robotics Lab and Applied Photonics and Nanophotonics Lab at the University, which are supported under the funding of The Department of Science & Technology (DST), Department of Biotechnology (DBT) and eYantra Project (IIT Bombay) and Indian Council of Medical Research, New Delhi, respectively.

b. Manually prepared face shields: The manually prepared face shields were designed in such a way that the front visor can be adjusted to cover the complete face along with the ears and down to the chest. The face shield also has a better air circulation from the top to the bottom giving comfort to the user while inhaling and exhaling.

The University shared the face shields with Tezpur Medical College & Hospital, Gauhati Medical College, Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute, Borgang Catholic Hospital, and Civil Hospital, Tezpur,

7. Aerosol box for medical staff: Prof. Pabitra Nath of the Dept. of Physics made some Aerosol boxes aimed at reducing risk of exposure to aerosol for medical personnel. These were distributed among hospitals in Tezpur.

8. Centrifuge Machine for medical staff: The Department of Molecular Biology & Biotechnology has shared with Tezpur Medical College & Hospital (TMCH) a centrifuge machine and some other resources to aid testing of COVID-19 samples at TMCH lab.



9. UVC germicidal chambers developed at Tezpur University:

In another move towards tackling COVID-19 pandemic, Tezpur University has developed UVC-germicidal chambers to ensure better safety for the employees of the University. The chamber is useful to sanitize mobile phones, car keys, wallets, etc. which are otherwise difficult to sanitize with chemical solutions. So far, seven UVC germicidal chambers have been developed and installed at different places within the campus. - Prof. Pradipeswar Bhattacharyya who served as the second Vice Chancellor of the University from June 14, 1999 to June 29, 2004 passed away on April 12, 2020 in Bengaluru.
