Report on Citizens Duties Awareness Programme 2020

(An initiative of Department of Justice, Ministry of Law & Justice, Government of India)

A print version of mail came from the Ministry of Law and Justice which was forwarded from the office of Vice Chancellor, Tezpur University and received by the law department on 22.06.2020. The letter was regarding participation in the “Citizens Duties Awareness Programme” which was initiated by the Ministry from 26th November, 2019. The department of law with the help of final year law students was expected to disseminate awareness on citizen’s duties among school going students. In the wake of Covid-19 pandemic situation many challenges came in selection of schools having minimum facility to communicate electronically and to establish coordination with the school authority. Initial plan was drafted as (Annexure-1) which was further changed and modified from time to time as per situation and communication with school authorities.

To disseminate awareness on citizen’s duties, final year students of Master of Laws (LL.M.) programme were divided into three groups comprising of three students per group. In each group a student was designated as group coordinator who was made responsible to communicate with school coordinator and fix day, date, time and share virtual link with all students of respective school. Each group have selected a topic and started collecting resource material and accordingly prepared ppt presentation. Those six topics on which power point presentation was prepared was-




1. Introduction to the Constitution, Preamble, Fundamental Rights and DPSP
2. Features of the Indian Constitution
3. Fundamental duties
4. Respect to National flag
5. National Anthem of India and its Importance
6. Brotherhood

Students apart from their regular classes and research work have undertaken this responsibility to deliver informative presentation on above six topics across the schools selected and with whom communication was established. Every week as per the schedule communicated by the school authority from time to time, each group collectively have presented their topic with the help of ppt in assigned schools. Each group was assigned different schools for presentation to avoid repetition of topic in the same school. For the initial weeks five schools have corresponded to our invitations and accordingly the programme was started from 29th August, 2020. The dates on which the programme was conducted was 29th August; 5th, 12th & 19th September; 3rd, 10th, 21st & 31st October and 26th November, 2020. On an average total 25 audience were benefited by each presentation on a day and more than 500 students(approx) have enriched themselves. Total 38 presentations were made by all groups. the presentation. The details of schools in which programme was conducted was-

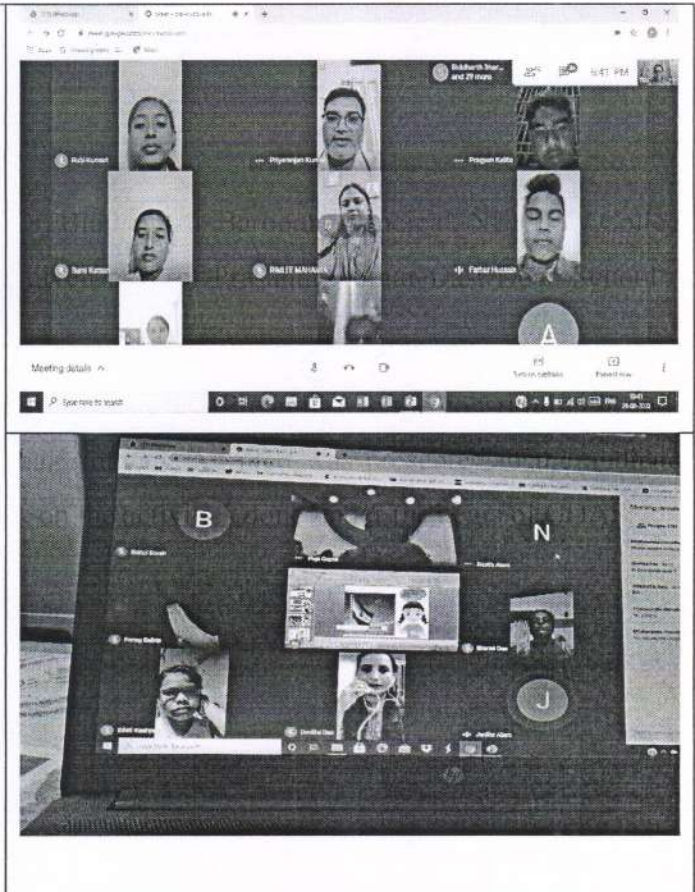
