At the outset of the meeting, the Vice-Chancellor expressed his greetings to all the members and apprised about the recent achievements of the University. He informed that the Times Higher Education (THE) Emerging Economies University Rankings 2018, ranked the University in 99th position. THE considered institutions from the 50 countries but the institutions of 42 countries only made the final top of the list of 378 institutions. He congratulated all the faculty members and staff and appealed to all of them to continue with their hard work to scale greater heights in the coming years. The Vice - Chancellor also congratulated Prof. A.K. Mukherjee for

receiving Visitor's Award for Best Research 2018 and Prof. Niranjana Karak for being awarded with the prestigious Fellow of the Royal Society of Chemistry (FRSC) in recognition of his contribution to the field of Chemistry. He informed that the University has been short listed by the UGC for the Intuitions of Eminence, but final out come is yet to come. The Vice Chancellor called upon the Controller of Examinations to present the Agenda items of the meeting. The Controller of Examinations presented the agenda items one by one as follows:

He informed that as per suggestion of the meeting for relaxation of shortage of attendance for the students representing the University for sports and cultural events, the concerned committee recommended that the Dean, Students' Welfare shall nominate the students to represent the University for sports and cultural events and for such students the percentage of attendance shall be calculated by the course instructors / teachers by excluding the lecture/ classes missed during the period of nomination.


