<p>AC.27/2016/2/2.9</p> <p>Note</p>	<p>Shifting of the Students of Integrated B.A.B.Ed. and B.Sc.B.Ed programmes to Integrated M.A. and Integrated M.Sc programmes</p> <p>The University introduced 4-year Integrated B.A.B.Ed. and B.Sc.B.Ed. programmes w.e.f. the academic year 2011 as per the decision of the meeting of the Vice Chancellors of all Central Universities with the then Hon'ble HRD Minister Shri Kapil Sibalji. The University had applied to National Council for Teachers Education (NCTE) for its clearance immediately after starting the programmes, however, the University did not receive any response from the NCTE as a result the University had to shift the students of Integrated B.A.B.Ed. and B.Sc.B.Ed programmes admitted in 2011, 2012 and 2013 to the Integrated M.A./ M.Sc. programme vide resolution no.AC.23/2014/2/13 of the 23rd meeting of the Academic Council held on 10th November, 2014. The University submitted the revised proposals to the NCTE as per their suggestions and was expecting the clearance from them w.e.f. 2014, however, the NCTE accorded clearance w.e.f. 2015. The batch of students admitted in 2014 did not receive the clearance from NCTE.</p> <p>The matter of non-receipt of clearance from NCTE for the batch of students admitted in 2014 (students now in 5th semester) was discussed in a meeting in presence of VC, PVC, Heads of the concerned Departments, Deans of concerned schools held on 29.09.2016 and recommended that 5th semester students of the Integrated B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. programme be awarded B.A. (Major)/B.Sc. (Major) degree after successful completion of the 6th semester and they be allowed to join Integrated M.A./ M.Sc. programmes in their 7th semester. It was also decided in the meeting that any shortfall of the course credit will be made up in the 6th semester by making special arrangements and while making such arrangement due care will be given to ensure that the course content will adequately be covered.</p> <p>All the students of the 5th semester Integrated B.A.B.Ed./ B.Sc.B.Ed. programme, except the students of the Department of Physics, have agreed for shifting to Integrated M.A./M.Sc. programme. Note	The Director, Center for Inclusive Development (CID) has submitted a proposal to make the Training & Placement Cell an independent cell taking it out of the Center for Inclusive Development. Further, he proposed that the cell may be rechristened as Placement & Career Development Cell. The meeting of all Deans with Vice Chancellor on 09.06.2016 also recommended that the Placement activities be taken out of center for Inclusive Development and rechristened as Placement and Career Development Cell. The cell be headed by Deputy Director (Training & Placement). The committee further opined that it would be better if the cell has a Professor-in-charge by rotation drawn from faculty members. Decision	Detaching the <i>Training & Placement Cell</i> from the <i>Centre for Inclusive Development</i> by upgrading it to a Centre may not be feasible as of date. Note	The fee structures of PhD programme for foreign candidates and for the programmes offered under CODL were placed in the 26 th meeting of the Academic Council held on 13 th May, 2016 for consideration. The meeting suggested to review the fee structure of the PhD programme for foreign students making rationale for Part-time and Full time. The meeting also suggested the Director, Centre for Open Distance Learning (CODL) to submit his proposal of course fee of MA in Assamese programme to be offered under CODL through the Central Fee Fixing Committee. 1. The Fee Fixing Committee discussed all the matters in its meeting held on 28.09.2016 and recommended for collection of the course fee of M.A./ M.Sc. programmes offered under CODL in two equal installments – once at the time of Registration/ Admission and the second at the time of re-registration in the 3 rd semester/ 2 nd year. The fee structures with break up of all programmes offered under CODL routed through the Fee fixing Committee are also placed for consideration.

	<p>2. The committee opined that the research guides need to put extra time and efforts for guiding the part- time PhD scholars especially during holidays and weekends as most of the part-time students are employed. Moreover, the part-time scholars being employed/ sponsored are able to pay a little bit extra than the full time candidates. Keeping these points in view, the meeting resolved that the existing fee structure of Ph.D. programme for foreign students may be considered for continuation until further revision.</p> <p>3. Further, there are 3 (three) separate fee structures for the students admitted to Ph.D. programme, these have been implemented w.e.f. Spring Semester 2009 onwards, Autumn Semester, 2011 onwards and Autumn Semester, 2014 onwards. The Committee recommended that the fee structure implemented for the Autumn Semester, 2014 on wards may be made applicable for all the Ph.D. students w.e.f. Spring Semester, 2017 by withdrawing earlier two fee structure to reduce the complexity.</p> <p>4. 

The two proposal of essay competitions are-


- (i) Bimal Bhagawati Essay Competition : This will be open for all lady students of the University.
