<b>Note</b>	<p>A committee was constituted with Prof. Utpal Sharma as Chairman to review and update the Regulations on Academic Matters. The committee had several rounds of discussions in the meeting of VC, PVC, Deans, Director IQAC and other members of the University. The draft Regulations on Academic Matters was also placed and discussed some of the points in the 33<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Academic Council held on 16.11.2018.</p>

	<p>The committee incorporated the suggestions of the meetings and submitted the revised Regulations for consideration of the University. The revised Regulations on Academic Matters-2019 is placed herewith at <b>Annexure- II, pp: 1-74</b></p> <p>Submitted for perusal and consideration of approval.</p>
<b>Discussions</b>	<p>After thorough discussion, the members suggested corrections in the Regulations. Some of the suggestions are given below:</p> <p>Clauses 2.5.1.: There should not be more than two (02) course instructors / coordinators for a teaching a course.</p> <p>Clause 2.5.3:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. In case of student participating in any co-curricular event, the minimum requirement of attendance be 70% in academic activities and 5% in co-curricular activities.</li> <li>ii. Students less than 40% attendance without any valid reason till Midterm test be not allowed to appear in the Mid-term test and Semester End Examinations and he be awarded w grade in the semester End Examinations.</li> </ol> <p>Clause 3.2.4 :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. The nomenclature of the examinations be as Sessional test I, sessional test II, Mid semester examination and End Semester Examination. Sl. 1 of clause 3.2.4 be modified as – the sessional test-I and II be conducted in the concerned Department/Centre by the concerned Course Instructors with the help of Academic and Research Staff, if required.</li> </ol> <p>Clause 3.2.5: Question papers be so designed that it can be assessed the intended learning outcomes of the students. And moderation of question paper be done taking assistance of the other faculty members of the department.</p> <p>Clause 3.2.6: The tenure of the Examination Committee be for 2(two) years instead of 3(three) years.</p> <p>Clause 3.2.11: Sub-clause 5 of be modified combining sub-clause 4 and 5.</p>
<b>Decision</b>	<p>Approved subject to inserting corrections / modifications as suggested by the members. The corrected version of the Regulations be submitted to the Vice Chancellor for his acceptance.</p>

In the Intellectual and Professional activities of table-II parameters such as (i ) Paper published/accepted for publication in peer reviewed journal and (ii) paper published/accepted in International conference proceedings/ book chapter with ISBN have been incorporated.</li> </ol> <p>The modified Rules for Selection of Best Graduate and T &amp; I Best postgraduate awards are placed <b>Annexure- V, pp: 111-117</b></p> <p>Subject to the ratification by the Academic Council, the modified Rules have been accorded approval by the Vice Chancellor.</p> <p>Submitted for perusal and consideration of ratification.</p>

The provision has not been found effective. Only one candidate was placed in the waiting list with this provision and no one got admission. The committee with Prof. Dhanapati Deka, Dean Students Welfare as Chairman requested to review the decision of the Academic Council on Sports Quota. Based on the report of the Committee, Deans Committee meeting held on 09.08.2019 recommended for creation of a provision for reserving 5(five) seats with not more than 1(one) seat per department on Supernumerary basis subject to satisfying the following conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. There should also be uniformity, as far as possible, in design of the Departmental webpages. He requested all the Deans of Schools to organize meeting with the office and technical staff on record keeping and webpage maintenance.
- (iii) The meeting also resolved to accept the report of Turnitin plagiarism Detection software for PhD thesis and in case of its non-availability, the online PDSR Plagiarism Detection software provided by the MHRD through INFLIBNET be used for checking the plagiarism of thesis and research papers.
- (iv) As per the proposal placed by the Dean, Management Science on the table, the Council approved to offer courses on Marketing Management, Financial Management and Human Resource Management (all core courses of the second semester) as Audit Course in the first semester to the students who will be going to pursue their second semester in Avans University, Netherland under student exchange programme. However, the Council advised the Department of Business Administration to take necessary steps immediately to modify the syllabi before admission of next batch of students.
